Performance Details

Of the 76 Care Leavers whose birthday fell in Q1, 58 were in suitable accommodation (76%). Four were in unsuitable accommodation (5%), which includes those in custody, and details were not available for the remainder. Performance in Q2 has fallen slightly because of a higher number of those where information was not available. There is ongoing work to increase the availability of appropriate accommodation via housing for care leavers. The work will look at reducing the use of some types of inappropriate accommodation. Systems are now in place to alert the Care Leavers team and senior management when care leavers re placed in some types of inappropriate accommodation. The HIT team is moving to be within the Care Leavers team which should reduce the amount of YP's in inappropriate accommodation overall. Multi-agency work is being done to increase the offers of accommodation to care leavers.

Of the 76 Care Leavers whose birthday fell in Q2, 43 were in employment, education or training (43%). This is slightly lower than Q1, and lower than performance in 2018/19. Of the 76, 29 were known not to be in employment, education or training, but details were not available for the remaining 14. NEET and PEP panel is to be reinstated after the school summer holiday's. This will look at all of those that are NEET and to try and offer solutions to enable them to access work or education. To continue to strengthen relationships between education and social care. To use the NEET / PEP panel to pick up on educational issues early on to try and reduce the amount of care leavers who become NEET.
