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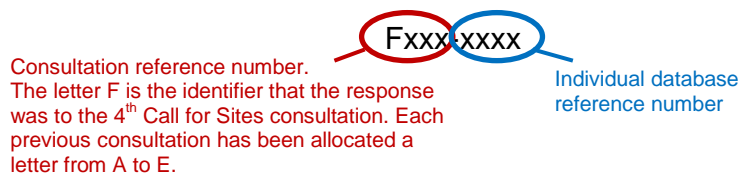
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Introduction

- 1.1 In developing the new Minerals Local Plan, Worcestershire County Council ran a 4th "Call for Sites" consultation from September 2017 to January 2018. This was designed to help address concerns raised in responses to the Third Stage Consultation on the Minerals Local Plan about the lack of enough Specific Site and Preferred Area site allocations to meet need over the life of the plan and the resulting reliance on windfall sites.
- 1.2 The 4th call for sites was open to all, with emails or letters sent to all those registered on the Council's planning consultation database for Minerals Planning Policy information, and the Council's communications team helped to target specific outlets¹, to try to increase awareness amongst landowners and operators to maximise their awareness of the opportunity to submit sites to be considered in the new Minerals Local Plan.
- 1.3 This document sets out the responses and site submissions received. The document is organised in two parts:
 - general comments; and
 - site proposals.
- 1.4 The Council is developing the methodology for screening all the sites which have been submitted during the course of developing the Minerals Local Plan. This method will be consulted on alongside the Fourth Stage Consultation on the Minerals Local Plan, and as such this document only presents the sites and a summary of the information submitted² and does not include any interpretation or consideration of the sites by the Council.

Notes on how the response sections are organised

- 1.5 Each response was allocated an individual response reference number. Responses to the 4th Call for Sites are in the format Fxxx-xxxx.

It is, however, the Energy Act 2013 that prohibits any development and most intrusive activities within the Easement Strip without specific consent from CLH Pipeline System. CLH Pipeline System Easement Strips are 6 metres wide and can incorporate other associated CLH Pipeline System facilities.</p> <p>Central Services will be able to provide guidance on the required procedures for entering into a Works Consent and provide confirmation on permitted development and intrusive activities.
