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## NATIONAL NEWS & UPDATES

### JCQ Access Arrangements Guidance

### Kooth Update

Kooth offer **24/7 instant access** to anonymous and personalised mental health support to your patients, including those who do not meet thresholds or are on a waiting list for CAMHS and NHS Talking Therapies.

A recent survey conducted amongst young people using Kooth showed that:

- 78% said they would be concerned or very concerned if Kooth was no longer available in their area
- 96% said it was important that they could access Kooth after school or work
- 97% said it was important that they did not need a referral to access Kooth
- 62% demonstrated a severe level of psychological distress
- 96% would recommend Kooth to a friend
- 88% said if they needed support in the future, they were likely to use Kooth

In April, Kooth are running webinars specifically to **help parents and carers with children sitting exams**. Please let your families know about this support available, especially if they are worried about their child's anxiety.

## Senior Mental Health Lead Training Grant

The latest data for the take-up of the DfE's senior mental health lead training grant has now been published and over 15,000 schools and colleges across the country have already benefitted from the offer.

The latest figures show take-up across Worcestershire is 74%, compared to 70% across the Midlands, and approximately 67% of state-funded schools and colleges nationally.

The DfE are keen to encourage further take up of the grant across the country, as having a trained senior mental health lead in a setting plays an important role in the whole school/college approach benefitting the mental health and wellbeing support for children and young people. This is a great opportunity for schools and colleges to access funded training which offers full flexibility to meet the needs of the individual setting.

### SEND and AP Change Programme - New Draft EHCP template

Currently Worcestershire are involved in a regional SEND Change Programme where we are being asked to trial a new EHCP template issued by the DfE. The aim is to improve the quality of plans and thus better supporting children and young people to enjoy maximum possible independence in adulthood. It will also make it easier for partners and professionals to work in consistent ways with shared language, especially those who work across different local areas.

As part of this programme, we will be issuing 80 plans in March/April on the new template. By trialing the new template this does not mean that any of our legal duties change, they remain the same.

We will also be seeking feedback from schools, parents/carers, young people and professionals.

## Early Years Inclusion Process

The Early Years Inclusion Process and the system to submit Early Years Inclusion Notifications launched on 1 November 2023. Since then we have received 139 new notifications for children under 5 in Worcestershire. Out of those 139 children the outcomes so far are:

- 75 children are being supported by the Early Years Inclusion Team (EYIT)
- 20 children are being supported by the Complex Communication Team (CCN)
- 15 children are being supported by an Early Years Language Class (EYLC)
- 29 children continue to have their needs met and are supported by their early years' provider. No further action is therefore required from the Early Years Inclusion Process.

We are continually reviewing our processes and welcome feedback from parents and professionals. If you have received support from WCF Inclusion Support Services since the 1 November 2023, we would love to hear from you!

## WCF Dyspraxia Pathway

The Learning Support Team are pleased to announce that the updated Dyspraxia Pathway is now available to download from the [WCF Inclusion website](#).

We have worked closely with the Children's Occupational Therapy Service to ensure that pupils with motor coordination difficulties are identified and assessed in a timely manner and that appropriate help and support is put in place. Using the Graduated Response, schools can continue to gather evidence so that if a further referral to OT is required, evidence of the strategies already used can be provided. The OT referral form now asks for details of what has already been tried in school:

As part of the pathway process information is gathered from the young person and from parents to gain a full picture of how difficulties are impacting on everyday life.

A workshop session on using the Dyspraxia Pathway to identify and support pupils with movement difficulties will be available at the Inclusion Conference in June.

## Cross LA SEND processes and health referrals

A reminder to SENCos and Inclusion Leaders that all EHCNA requests should be made to the Local Authority within which the pupil resides. For example, should a child or young person attend a Worcestershire school but live in a neighbouring authority, then an EHCNA request should be submitted to the LA linked to the child or young person's home address.

The same applies for some health referral pathways (e.g. ADHD Pathway) so please be sure to check this with the specific referral team and Healthcare Trust.

This is particularly pertinent to schools close to the LA border where it may be necessary to engage with up to 3 different Local Authorities and healthcare Trusts.

Where it is known that a proportion of your school's pupils reside in neighbouring authorities, it is good practice to include links to each authority's 'SEND Local Offer' within the SEND information published on your school website.

## Hereford and Worcester Dyslexia Association (HWDA)

Last year the Hereford and Worcester Dyslexia Association (HWDA) updated their website and most recently, have been adding video content to reach a wider audience, become more inclusive and to provide support for families of children with specific learning difficulties and for professionals involved with teaching them. Videos include: See Dyslexia Differently, Definition of Dyslexia, Understanding Dyslexia and Dyslexic Thinking.

The HWDA proudly celebrates Dyslexic Thinking Skills and the Parents' area of their website has a user friendly guide - The Strengths Dyslexic Thinking brings to Individuals. The Children's area celebrates Amazing Dyslexic Storytellers and What makes you Xtraordinary? There is a lot of other content, including a quiz and jokes which might appeal.

On their Facebook page you will find videos from their visit to The Dyslexia Show 2024. They attended a seminar and spoke with Dr Susie Nyman on the multisensory approach needed for children with dyslexia. They interviewed the Dyscalculia Network, Flexitables and attended a very informative seminar on Dyscalculia Inclusive Maths Intervention. Other videos include Nasen teaching units to share with schools, moving barriers to learning. A discussion about Executive Functioning with Connection in Mind and Left n Write. Further information and useful websites, plus training and resources will be added to their website.

The HWDA tutor children with specific learning difficulties, including Dyslexia, Dyscalculia and Dyspraxia during term time through 'Workshops' in Bromsgrove on Fridays after school and in Worcester on Saturday mornings with a mid-week workshop opening soon. In addition, Hereford Workshop tutors on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Through their specialist teaching they teach children the way they learn using multisensory techniques. They tutor individually and in groups from ages 6-18, including Study Skills, English and Maths.

The HWDA is a charity, which has been established for nearly 50 years and aims to support as many students who need their help, finances not seen as a barrier. For that reason they offer bursaries to families that need them. As a Charity they aim to raise funds to allow them to provide this support. They are always looking for willing volunteers to help organise events or make contact with companies to share their work. If you have the willingness and a little spare time, they would love to hear from you.

## Supporting children's Emotional Health and Wellbeing in the classroom

This course is aimed at teachers and teaching assistants, in helping to support children who are experiencing difficulties accessing the school day. There is an increase in children who are struggling with their emotional wellbeing, which is impacting them and all those around them.

During the 90 minutes, we will be looking at everyday practical strategies, that can be easily implemented and used, to help not only those children who dysregulate, but all children in the classroom. The strategies will help adults to support those children who require a different approach, in order to make their school day more successful and a positive experience.

It is important that children are emotionally regulated and understand their emotions, which in turn will not only positively impact their educational experience but will also help support a productive classroom environment.

### NASEN - SEND Teacher Handbook

On 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2024, nasen published an updated version of the SEND Teacher Handbook which is available for free download. This handbook has been developed as a resource for teachers to use over time as they embed inclusive practice in their classrooms: it is not intended that it is read cover-to-cover. It has been written for both primary, secondary and specialist colleagues: teaching assistants, teachers, senior leaders and headteachers. The handbook includes whole-school and whole-class approaches as well as subject-specific and condition-specific guidance.

It brings together practical examples of high-quality teaching - placing focus on removing barriers to learning, getting to know and understand individual learners, and bringing to life the graduated approach. With three completely new subject-specific chapters for History, Geography and Religious Education, it offers a wealth of ideas and information about the following key areas:

- Planning inclusive lessons
- Creating including environments
- Curriculum considerations for KS3 and 4
- Strategies to scaffold learning
- Vocabulary retentions
- Supporting learners who need additional conceptual understanding

## SHINE A LIGHT - SHARING EFFECTIVE PRACTICE

### Worcestershire Autism Mentor (WAM) 2024 Conference Highlights

In February, WCF held its first Worcestershire Autism Mentor (WAM) Conference. A big “thank you” to everyone who participated to make the day a success – and we mean everyone! WAM’s especially, as without them, there would be no conference and a gap in what Worcestershire schools provide for autistic pupils.

The conference opened with parent, Hazel, sharing insights into what was helpful and what was unhelpful for her, and her son, as they journeyed through the education system, from Reception to University. This provoked thoughtful discussion, and feedback has highlighted changes that WAM’s intend to make in their practice and offer in school. Mentors had sessions on the use of games to promote social interaction and connection, and the use of energy meters as practical emotional regulation strategies. There was a presentation on psychological theory around autism and how interpretation of this has evolved over the years.

The day closed with highlights of what is happening in settings where there is a WAM. The creation of WAM displays, hubs, resources submitted by WAM’s, and case studies were spotlighted to show how WAM’s are taking the initiative and developing their role. Information around enhancing and extending the programme was shared. WAMs were also introduced to the upcoming ‘Me’ resource, which will be shared with WAM’s for children who do not have a diagnosis of autism but have similar Complex Communication Needs.
